Monroe County } I, William B. Coz. of the County

and State aforesaid, being now in health, and weak in
body but of sound mind, do hereby make this my last
will and testament, and do hereby will and bequeath
unto my beloved wife, Rodey Coz. all my property both
real and personal, in this State and the State of Mississippi
to have and to hold, and enjoy the same, during her natural
life or widowhood. Should she get married then in that
event it is my will that the property shall be divided,
among my lawful heirs to wit, my beloved wife Rodey
Coz. and my children, (to wit) the heirs of John C. Coz.
George W. Coz. Abert. H. B. Coz. Marins Bogard. Nancy
V. Weatherford. Francis L. Coz. Martha Ann Coz. William
C. H. Coz. Joseph J. Coz. & Rodey E. Coz. and I do hereby
fully empower and Enjoin upon my wife Rodey, to pay all
just demands against my estate, and to collect all moneys
that it justly due to me, and to keep the property as nearly
together as she can, and to manage the same as best
she can for her interest and that of my children, in testimony
of which I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal this
